

## June 4, 2017 ~ Pentecost Sunday



Pentecost (meaning "50th day") is the 50th day of the Easter season, which it also concludes. Having been raised from the dead on Easter, Jesus was "taken up" to heaven in His glorified body on the 40th day (the Ascension).

Now, on Pentecost, He fulfills the promise to send His Spirit, which makes Him present in His Church (and in each baptized member) in a new, abiding, mystical way. The paschal mystery is thus complete.

Pentecost was the Greek and Latin name for the old Jewish

harvest festival, the Feast of Weeks; but as we see in Acts, the new Christian "harvest" is one of souls "from every nation under heaven" (2:5). The Spirit now reverses the linguistic divisions created at Babel and empowers the disciples to preach boldly in every tongue. Pentecost is a vital part of the divine plan to "renew the face of the earth." Alyce M. McKenzie, a professor of homiletics at the Perkins School of Theology at Southern Methodist University, tells of a priest friend named Frank, who was in his mid-30s when the call to ministry took him by surprise. He was fine with program planning, working with volunteers, even leading small groups, but preaching scared him to death. Frank was so nervous about preaching that he resorted to prayer.



Every day for 20 minutes he would picture himself preaching with Jesus standing next to him with His arm around his shoulder. He told McKenzie, "Alyce, it wasn't a magic cure, but each week, preaching got a little more bearable, degree by degree." McKenzie recounts: "One Sunday, a young mom came up to Frank with her daughter, Ashley.... She was 7, and she was shy. But her mom said, 'Father Frank, Ashley has something to show you.' Frank knelt to be at

eye level, and Ashley held out her

children's bulletin. She said, softly, 'Look at what I drew today.

This is you, Father Frank. And guess Who this is?' It was Jesus, of course, with His arm around Frank's shoulder. The inside story' of Pentecost is a story in progress."

# PENTECOST SUNDAY THE OUTPOURING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT



The central purpose of Jesus' mission, which culminated in the gift of the Holy Spirit, was to renew our relationship with the Father, a relationship severed by sin, to take us from our state of being orphaned children and to restore us as His sons and daughters. The paternity of God is reestablished in us thanks to the redemptive work of Christ and the gift of



redemptive work of Christ and the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit is given to us by the Father and leads us back to the Father. The entire work of salvation is one of "regeneration," in which the fatherhood of God, through the gift of the Son and the Holy Spirit, frees us from the condition of being orphans into which we had fallen. In our own day also, we see various signs of our being orphans: in the

interior loneliness which we feel even when we are surrounded by people, a Ioneliness which can become an existential sadness; in the attempt to be free of God, even if accompanied by a desire for His presence; in the all-too-common spiritual illiteracy which renders us incapable of prayer; in the difficulty in grasping the truth and reality of eternal life as that fullness of communion which begins on earth and reaches full flower after death; in the effort to see others as "brothers" and "sisters," since we are children of the same Father; and other such signs. Being children of God runs contrary to all this

and is our primordial vocation. We were made to be God's children, -it is in our DNA. But this filial relationship was ruined and required the sacrifice of God's Only Begotten Son in order to be restored. From the immense gift of love which is Jesus' Death on the cross, the Holy Spirit has been poured out upon humanity like a vast torrent of grace. Those who by faith are immersed into this mystery of regeneration are reborn to the fullness of filial life. I will not leave you orphans. Today, on the feast of Pentecost, Jesus' words remind us also of the



maternal presence of Mary in the Upper Room. The Mother of Jesus is with the community of disciples gathered in prayer: she is the living remembrance of the Son and the living invocation of the Holy Spirit. She is the Mother of the Church. We entrust to her intercession, in a particular way, all Christians, families, and communities that at this moment are most in need of the Spirit.

the Paraclete, the Defender and Comforter, the Spirit of truth, freedom, and peace. The Spirit, as Saint Paul says, unites us to Christ: Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to Him. (Rom 8:9). Strengthening our relationship of belonging to the Lord Jesus, the Spirit enables us to enter into a new experience of fraternity. By means of our universal: Brother—Jesus—we can relate to one another in a new way; no longer as orphans, but rather as children of the same good and merciful Father. And this changes everything! We can see each other as brothers and sisters whose differences can only increase our joy and wonder at sharing in this unique fatherhood and brotherhood.

# SCRIPTURAL REFLECTIONS for the SACRED FEAST OF PENTECOST



By the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost, Christ's Paschal Mystery was brought to its completion. The Holy Spirit prepares us with his grace in order to draw us to Christ. He manifests the Risen Lord to us, opening our minds. He makes present the mystery of Christ. And he reconciles us, bringing us into

communion with God. Saint Thomas Aquinas says that the Holy Spirit interiorly perfects our spirit, communicating to it a new dynamism so that it refrains from evil for love. With the Holy Spirit within us, "it is quite natural for people who had been absorbed by the things of this world to become entirely otherworldly in outlook, and for cowards to become people of great courage" (Saint Cyril of Alexandria).

# THE GIFT OF GRACE FROM THE HOLY SPIRIT ~PENTECOST

From all eternity, the Father looks at the Son and the Son looks at the Father. What each sees is utter perfection and beauty. And so each, as Venerable Fulton Sheen said, sighs His love for the other. This shared breath is what our tradition calls the Spiritus Sanctus, the love breathed back and forth between the Father and the Son.

This is the same Holy Spirit that hovered over the chaotic waters at creation, that spoke through the prophets and patriarchs, that overshadowed the Virgin at the Annunciation, that drove Jesus into the desert, and that the Lord breathed (appropriately enough) on His disciples the night of Easter. How marvelous that this sacred breath is associated with the forgiveness of sins: Receive the Holy Spirit, Jesus said. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained. In an acrobatic act of love, the Father sent the Son all the way to the limits of godforsakenness, all the way to the furthest end of our rebellion and isolation. This is the central drama of the cross. Then, in the Holy Spirit, He drew the whole fallen world which the Son had embraced, back to Himself. And this is precisely why the Spirit is the great principle of mercy. In the words of absolution, the priest prays, "God the Father of mercies, through the death and resurrection of His Son has reconciled the world Himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins." On the feast of Pentecost, we celebrate the fact that this breath, this wind, this hurricane of mercy has been loosed upon the world.
