Youth Pilgrimage Update

On September 19, 2015, Bishop Paprocki will travel to Robinson to celebrate the 4:30 pm Mass at St. Elizabeth and to bless the "Welcoming Jesus" statue. He will also be blessing the pilgrims who are going to see Pope Francis in Philadelphia. The Youth and pilgrims will be departing from Robinson in the early evening on Thursday, September 24, 2015 and arriving in New York City on Friday, September 25, 2014. On Friday, they will see historic landmarks such as St. Patrick's Cathedral, Ground Zero and Ellis Island. They will continue sight seeing on Saturday, September 26 and travel to Philadelphia on Sunday for the Mass with Pope Francis. This mass will be held on Benjamin Franklin Parkway. Following the mass, the Youth and pilgrims will return to Robinson and will arrive early in the morning on Mon. Sept. 28, 2015.

Shepherd News

Scriptural News

Up to this point in his service to God as a prophet, Elijah has always acted with a clear directive from the Lord. But in this reading, Elijah proceeds without any divine instruction. It seems he is acting on his own. This explains why Elijah is, for the first time in the narratives about him, filled with fear. Ideally, the prophet should await a word from God. Instead, Elijah flees from Queen Jezebel, who has sworn to take his life because he slew her prophets.

Elijah finds refuge in the desert and rests under the shade of a tree that apparently provides plenty of shade from the sun. It seems the prophet has plans to go no farther. In fact, he declares that his service to God is at an end and requests that God take his life. Then he goes to sleep, confidently expecting God to grant his request. But God has others plans for this prophet—as he will discover once he arrives where God will lead him.

A heavenly messenger wakens him and orders him to eat and drink what God has provided for him. Elijah complies, but then he simply lies down again and waits for God to answer his prayer for escape in death. A second time, the messenger of God wakens him and orders him to eat. This time Elijah discovers that God wants him to take the long journey to the same mountain where God once appeared to Moses. On that mountain, Elijah will learn that God is not granting

his request to die, but has more work for him to do. As a prophet, Elijah must serve God's designs rather than his own

The crowd, now identified as Jews, responds with skepticism and murmuring to Jesus' declaration that he is the bread that came down from heaven. This is to remind us of the similar response the Israelites gave to Moses in their desert wanderings. Jesus, not the manna, is God's life-giving gift to the world. Much of the crowd's skepticism is rooted in the fact that they know Jesus and his father and mother. He is only an ordinary person from down the street. Certainly, he did not come down from heaven.

At this point, Jesus pushes his claims further by indicating that it is only through God's initiative that a person can come to Jesus and thus be raised up on the last day. People do not come to Jesus on their own inventiveness. This is a central theological theme found in the Gospel of Jn. Further support is elicited from the prophets—even though it is not clear which prophet is meant (Is 54:13; Jer 31:33). Coming to the Father involves "listening" and "learning." The implication here is that the crowd has failed in both its listening and its learning. They have preferred murmuring over listening and learning—and thus remain in their ignorance.
