Youth Pilgrimage Update

On September 19, 2015, Bishop Paprocki will travel to Robinson to celebrate the 4:30 mass at St. Elizabeth and to bless the "Welcoming Jesus" statue. He will also be blessing the pilgrims who are going to see Pope Francis in Philadelphia. The Youth and pilgrims will be departing from Robinson in the early evening on Thursday, September 24, 2015 and arriving in New York City on Friday, September 25, 2014. On Friday, they will see historic landmarks such as St. Patrick's Cathedral, Ground Zero and Ellis Island. They will continue sight seeing on Saturday, September 26 and travel to Philadelphia on Sunday for the mass with Pope Francis. This mass will be held on Benjamin Franklin Parkway.

Following the mass, the Youth and pilgrims will return to Robinson and will arrive early in the morning on Monday, September 28, 2015.

Scriptural Reflections

Amos lived in an age of rebellion. Solomon's misguided policies led to a split within the kingdom, north and south. God gave every advantage to the first king of the north to survive as a faithful servant. But Jeroboam rebelled against God by refusing to allow his subjects to worship in the Jerusalem temple. Instead, Jeroboam established a rival sanctuary in Bethel. This was not God's plan. So God sent Amos north to awaken the king to his mistaken ways.

Amos serves God faithfully. He is like a plumb-line placed against a crooked wall. His very presence in Bethel makes it clear how off-the-mark the city is from God's ways. Amaziah serves as priest in Jeroboam's false place of worship. Out of loyalty to the wayward king Jeroboam, Amaziah rejects the prophet's message. He regards Amos as nothing more than a court prophet seeking to make a living by presuming to speak for God. Court prophets were notorious for speaking only what their royal benefactors wanted to hear.

Amos is not intimidated by Amaziah's rebuff. He makes it clear he is not prophesying for personal reasons. He had a livelihood in Judah. He tended sheep and cultivated fruit trees. But God gave his work new meaning by sending him as a prophet to God's people in Israel. Now he tends God's flock. Thus, Amos'

response to Amaziah is that he is, in fact, a true prophet representing the court of heaven. He is not serving a mere earthly king as Amaziah assumes.

Today's Gospel describes the third time Jesus has an encounter with his disciples. First, he simply calls Simon, Andrew, James, and John to leave their boats and follow him (Mk 1:16-20). Second, Jesus appoints 12 men to be his disciples, but at this time, he does not authorize them to do anything. In this third encounter, Jesus goes further in that he calls the Twelve, sends them out as official witnesses (two by two), and authorizes them to have power over unclean spirits (Mk 6:7-13). This third encounter completes the process wherein the disciples are commissioned to preach and cast out unclean spirits.

What is important here is that Jesus authorizes his disciples to do what he himself does: preach and heal. Their power is a shared power and depends on their staying close to Jesus, the source of their authority. Disciples of Jesus are to remain disciples their whole lives. They are never to become the master, and they are not authorized to go out on their own. By staying close to Jesus, the disciples are able to share in the very power that Jesus himself exercises.
