Scriptural Reflections

In earlier chapters of his book, Daniel interpreted dreams for others (chs 2 and 4). But in chs 7 to 12, as Daniel ponders visions regarding the future of his people, an angel is his interpreter. Just as Daniel's interpretations proved true for the kings of Babylon, the interpretation by God's messenger will be all the more true for the people of Israel. The actual historical background for this book is probably the Jewish Revolt of 167 to 164 B.C.

This reading comes at the end of a vision rehearsing the historical circumstances surrounding the people of Israel, beginning with Alexander the Great's victory over Persia in 333 B.C. (11:3). Especially prominent in this review is the distress endured by the people during the reign of Antiochus IV, whose harsh policies sparked the revolt led by Judas Maccabaeus. Daniel describes this king "exalting himself and making himself greater than any god . . ." (11:36).

By God's design, Michael appears as Israel's guardian and patron. With this divine emissary to protect them, God's faithful people will escape any threat launched against them by earthly powers. The theme of protection is prominent in narratives of this book, e.g., Daniel in the lion's den (chs 6 and 14); the three friends in the furnace (ch 3); Susanna falsely accused of infidelity (ch 13). Famously, this reading is

unique in the Hebrew Bible for its explicit reference to the resurrection of the dead. As the reading asserts in its final verses, God's faithful ones will awake from the dust of the earth and shine like brilliant stars forever.

The passage opens with Jesus addressing his disciples about some kind of catastrophic end, described as "that tribulation." He appears to be talking about the end of the world or the Day of the Lord. References are from Is 13:10 and 34:4. The passage uses apocalyptic language which by nature is symbolic. We are not to take these images literally. The author is affirming that the present world will end, but he is not telling us exactly how that will take place. The images indicate that the final end will be cosmic in scope.

Mark's community has endured suffering, and its members wonder how long this will go on or how much they can endure. The evangelist tells them that the final end will be soon; then things will change substantially for the better. For this encouragement, the author uses the Son of Man imagery taken largely from Daniel 7:13-14. This is imagery that Mk also used for Jesus as part of his messianic identity. Mk wants to tell his community that faithfulness will be rewarded and a new community established
