

Scriptural Reflections

In the first reading, John sees a countless number of people from every nation on earth. These are the people who survived the "time of great distress." They gave witness to the Lamb, and now they wear robes of victory as they stand before the throne of God. The court of heaven gives praise to God for this work of salvation. Their praise is perfect; it includes seven components, all associated in some way with God's saving power.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus begins his famous Sermon on the Mount by ascending a mountain, assuming the authoritative position of sitting, and addressing his words to his disciples. There is more than a little similarity to Moses in that Jesus earlier on escaped death, entered Egypt, went into the wilderness, and now ascends a mountain. It was on Mount Sinai that Moses received the 10 Commandments from God, and it is on a mountain that Jesus prepares to proclaim a new righteousness to his followers.

Jesus begins his teaching by declaring his hearers to be blessed. The Greek word used here (makarios) carries the meaning of happy, fortunate, or blessed. Such forms are found throughout the entire OT, but especially in the wisdom books. Thus, Jesus is rooting his teaching in his own Jewish background and tradition. The content of these Beatitudes reflects the content of Is 61:1–3, a passage that

was very significant for the early Christians in their understanding of the mission of Jesus.

The most important Beatitude is the first one. The poor in spirit are people who are not only materially poor, but who have come to realize that they are dependent on God for all that they have. Ultimately, this realization will lead to the kingdom of heaven. What follows is a series of situations characterized by diminishment, which in the kingdom of heaven will be reversed. The reason for being happy, fortunate, or blessed is that the diminishment is not everlasting. It leads to a positive reversal in the age to come.

Beatitudes expand the vision and the hope of those who hear them. They are filled with good news: that there is more to living out the teachings of Jesus than immediately meets the eye. While the present time may be filled with suffering and hardships, these situations are only temporary.

What has begun as the kingdom of heaven is now only partial, but it will reach its fullness at the end of time. This will bring with it the grand reversals indicated in these Beatitudes. For this reason, the hearers of Jesus' teaching are to rejoice and be glad. Their reward will be great in heaven. The saints testify to this.
