Scriptural Reflections

Daniel served as the interpreter of dreams in the court of kings. But in chapters 7 to 12, Daniel himself needs an interpreter for the visions he sees. Since Daniel's interpretations proved true, how much more true will be the interpretations he receives from heavenly messengers. This reading describes one of the scenes in Daniel's first vision. Three powerful beasts emerge from a great sea representing chaos. The beasts stand for various earthly kingdoms. Then comes a fourth beast more terrible than the others with its iron teeth and ten horns. This fourth creature represents the kingdom that was oppressing Israel in the days of the Maccabean War.

As Daniel looks on, a very different scene replaces the vision of the beasts. Now he sees the court of heaven with God seated on a throne surrounded by fire (Dn 7:9-10). The heavenly court has reached a verdict against the arrogant kings of the earth. God is the Ancient One, a title contrasting the eternal God with the transitory kingdoms of earth. Daniel then sees "one like a son of man" approaching the throne. His appearance is refreshingly more appealing than that of the beasts.

The son of man is surrounded by the clouds of heaven, contrasting with the threatening waters of the sea from which the beasts emerged. God gives this son of man authority to rule over all the

earth. The scene thus gives Daniel the assurance that, despite all evidence to the contrary in his own time, the reign of God will prevail. No earthly power can take away the kingship granted the son of man.

This passage is taken from the trial scene where Jesus is being interrogated by Pilate, who directly asks Jesus, "Are you the King of the Jews?" This question is the governing motif of the entire trial. What is meant by the word king? Pilate means it in a political way, but Jesus understands it theologically. This interplay between politics and theology runs throughout the entire trial.

Notice that Jesus never directly answers any of Pilate's questions. Instead, he responds to Pilate with a question of his own. This reverses the roles of interrogator and responder. In effect, Jesus is interrogating Pilate, who has become the one actually on trial. Irony also plays an important role in this situation. Pilate despises Jews and does not want to be identified with them in any way. He makes that clear by saying, "I am not a Jew, am I?" But in a way he is. At least, he is one with the Jews in that both have rejected Jesus. Pilate's rejection is based on politics. The Jews' rejection is based on theology.
