Shepherd News

Scriptural Reflections

Tradition attributes this book to King Solomon, famous for his wisdom. This passage is one reason for that attribution. The wise king is speaking directly to the reader as he recalls, it seems, his remarkable dream in 1 Kgs 3:5–14. Historically, Solomon's reign was fraught with spiritual weaknesses. In his assessment of the king's life, Sirach faults him for the foolishness that put a stain on his honor (Sir 47:20–21). The unit from which this reading comes claims a central role in the book. It is preceded by chapters displaying the advantages of serving God (Wis 1–6); it is followed by chapters contrasting the foolish with the wise (Wis 10–18). In the center, "Solomon" explains that true wisdom is beyond human capacity; it can be acquired only as a gift from God.

And so the king offers a prayer to God, pleading for the gift of wisdom, which God grants readily. The king speaks of wisdom as the perfect partner. In her company, the king also enjoys many good things in the material world. Later verses explain that she represents God's saving purpose, seeking out God's children to lead them along the path of life (Wis 7:22–30).

The king values wisdom over all else. He explains that wisdom is preferable to royal power. No earthly treasure can match the quality and value of wisdom. The king dismisses gemstones, gold, and silver as nothing more than bits of sand by comparison. Health

and beauty fade in comparison to wisdom. Even the light of this world cannot compare with wisdom because the light of wisdom, coming from God, is unfading.

Today's Gospel contains three major segments, all in some way addressing the issues of riches. First, Jesus has an encounter with a man who wants to follow him. Second, Jesus will give several instructions to his disciples about riches. Third, Jesus will address the questions of rewards for discipleship. The basic emphasis that is made in all three situations is that wealth can indeed be an obstacle to discipleship—while the rewards inherent in discipleship are much greater than the sacrifices involved.

A man confronts Jesus with the title of "good teacher," asking what he must do to inherit eternal life (the kingdom of God). Jesus does not accept the title of "good teacher" for some reason, but he instructs the man to keep the commandments. The man has a long tradition of keeping the commandments; so Jesus pushes him a bit further. He tells the man he lacks one thing. He is to sell what he has, give the proceeds to the poor, and then follow Jesus. The man cannot do that, and so he goes away sad. We are not told why the man could not part with his many possessions. He is not portrayed as greedy or in any way a bad person. He simply was wealthy; his wealth controlled his life.
