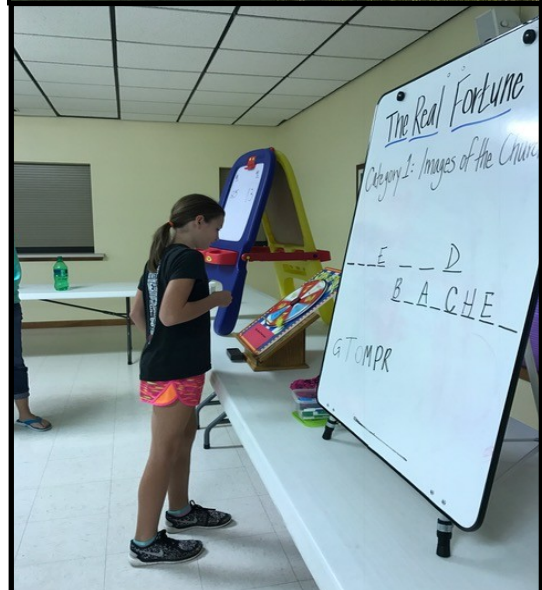

Fr. Flach Scriptural Reflections for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the book Luke: Interpretation: A Bible Commentary for Teaching & Preaching, Rev. Fred B. Craddock, a renowned professor of homiletics, wrote on today's Gospel. Rev. Craddock scoffed at those who speak far too flippantly about prayer, saying that too many of the overly pious speak of prayer like "someone drawing answers from a hat." What Rev. Craddock wants to emphasize is that prayer takes work, discipline & perseverance. To emphasize his point, he tells of a large gathering of people who were concerned about unfair & oppressive conditions in our society. At the gathering, an elderly black minister read today's passage & gave a one-sentence interpretation: "until you have stood for ten years knocking at a locked door, your knuckles bleeding, you do not really know what prayer is." Luke's Gospel is filled with accounts of Jesus in prayer. Along with today's passage, Luke tells us that Jesus sometimes prayed all night. In His Passion account, Luke describes Jesus as "in such agony" & praying so fervently that His sweat became like drops of blood falling on the ground."

For some weeks, we have been reading from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy. Timothy grew up with a deep knowledge of the Hebrew Scriptures; but it seems that he became a convert of Paul in Lystra after hearing Paul speak about Jesus using the Hebrew Scriptures to teach. Paul took Timothy on some of his missionary journeys, & while they were together, Paul ordained Timothy for ministry by the laying on of hands.

Eventually Nero came to power & began persecuting Christians. Paul already had been accused of not upholding Caesar &, instead, preaching Christ. By the time he wrote to Timothy, Paul had been thrown into prison, chained, & was soon to be executed. Timothy had, by that time, become a pastor in Ephesus. In Paul's letters, Timothy seems to have been sickly, timid, & young, but he was also a gifted teacher.

Under persecution, Peter & most of the Apostles were dead, & Paul would soon be dead. Christianity was being passed to a new generation. Would it survive? Would Christians stay faithful to the teaching of Jesus Christ? Would persecution, or worse, infighting, destroy all that had been handed on by Jesus through His Apostles? Would people remember what they had been taught? Paul's advice, Paul's pleading, was for Timothy "to remain faithful to what you have learned & believed."

Paul reminded Timothy that the Sacred Scriptures are capable of giving wisdom for salvation. He especially reminded Timothy that "all Scripture is inspired by God." Literally, the phrase means "all scripture is breathed by God." (The word inspiration comes from the same word we use for respiration.) Paul reminded Timothy that there are only two ways to know God. One is through the Scriptures; the other is through prayer.

Can we say that we talk to God with the same regularity & intensity that a couple in love would talk?

As Moses grew weary, the battle of life & death with the Amalekites began to go against the Israelites. Only with assistance could Moses hold up his staff, the standard of God. To whom do we turn when we grow weary? Do we rely on our community of faith? Do we support our community of faith as Aaron & Hur supported Moses while he prayed for Joshua? Is our prayer only solitary, or do we make time to pray with our community of faith & help hold it up as Aaron & Hur held up the arms of Moses? When we falter in our faith life, do we seek assistance, or do we let our relationship with God slowly slip from our grasp?

If God does not respond right away to our prayers, do we give up? Do we love our faithfulness? According to Luke, Jesus prayed constantly & fervently. Jesus actually prayed that "this cup," His Passion, would be taken away. Did Jesus give up when that did not happen? Jesus teaches us that a widow, the most defenseless in society, got her way with the most powerful man in the community, & this man was unjust as well. God is not the Unjust Judge. God is just & compassionate, yet do we go to Him often enough? When Jesus comes, when He examines our life of prayer, will He find faith?
