# Shepherd News

## Scriptural Reflections

This oracle celebrates the success of a special Servant of God. So many in Isaiah's book failed to carry out what God wanted of them. The successors to the throne of David, their courtiers, even the people of Israel did not listen to the challenges prophets like Isaiah presented to them. Isaiah's whole purpose was to steer Israel back to the path of life. Israel refused to listen; they wandered off to seek their own interests rather than the interests of God. The Servant celebrated in this reading succeeded where the rest failed.

The first line makes the startling assertion that God was pleased the Servant experienced such crushing pain. This runs counter to the character of God typically portrayed in the Bible. God is not pleased with suffering in itself. But if such affliction serves to advance others on the journey of faith, then God is pleased. In this case, the Servant's misery became a sacrifice for the sins of others. His suffering helped so many others recognize their spiritual weaknesses. He became a model for them, inspiring them to change their ways and serve God with their lives, too.

The Servant gave his life for others. But the Servant's story does not end with death. God says the Servant is the victor. The Servant will see generations after him enjoying many benefits from what he accomplished.

God's plan of salvation was advanced by what the Servant did. The Servant will enjoy a light superior to

any created light. His joy will not be bound by the limits of time.

Today's Gospel comes from Jesus' third passion prediction. This consists of three points: First, Jesus tells his disciples that he will suffer, die, and be raised up. Second, the disciples have no idea what Jesus means and thus misunderstand what he is saying. Third, Jesus offers a corrective teaching to counter the disciples' misunderstanding. The current passage includes the second and third points stated above.

Jesus' corrective teaching focuses on leadership. He points out how gentile rulers lord it over people with power and coercion. His own disciples also appear to find this model of leadership attractive. Jesus makes it very clear that authentic leadership is first and foremost about service—not about domination. If there is power involved, it is the power to serve and not the power to rule. This model of servant leadership understands that to be great means to serve much. The ideal model for such leadership is none other than Jesus himself. He serves by giving his entire life "as a ransom for many."

Today, priests and deacons are reminded in the rite of ordination while lying face down on the floor that they are being ordained to serve and not to be served.
