Youth Pilgrimage Update

On September 19, 2015, Bishop Paprocki will travel to Robinson to celebrate the 4:30 pm Mass at St. Elizabeth and to bless the "Welcoming Jesus" statue. He will also be blessing the pilgrims who are going to see Pope Francis in Philadelphia. The Youth and pilgrims will be departing from Robinson in the early evening on Thursday, September 24, 2015 and arriving in New York City on Friday, September 25, 2014. On Friday, they will see historic landmarks such as St. Patrick's Cathedral, Ground Zero and Ellis Island. They will continue sight seeing on Saturday, September 26 and travel to Philadelphia on Sunday for the Mass with Pope Francis. This mass will be held on Benjamin Franklin Parkway. Scriptural Reflections

The opening chapters of this book present two contrasting viewpoints about life in this world. The ideal viewpoint finds wisdom in placing God above all else in life. The other viewpoint ascribes wisdom to the pursuit of worldly values alone. In this reading, we hear the misguided thinking of faithless people as they scheme to prove there is nothing to be gained by placing all trust in God.

The just in this world recognize the wisdom of living by the standards of heaven. They respect the law as a gift from God. They recognize that a life lived in such gratitude is the most realistic way to live. The wicked, on the other hand, choose to ignore this truth. They choose to substitute the traditions of their ancestors for the illusions of human pride and glory. They are not interested in the honest exploration of the way of truth; they deliberately reject it. Rather than learn from people of faith, they want to remove them from their world, dismissing them as obnoxious interferences.

The wicked are prepared to go so far as to condemn the just to death. They presume the mere removal of God's faithful servants will end their challenge. The flaw in their plan is presuming that life is measured only by this world. They fail to see that God fashioned

people for immortality. The wicked cannot even imagine the world to come and the gift of eternal life awaiting God's faithful servants.

This passage describes the occasion where Jesus predicts his suffering, death, and resurrection for the second time. Mk indicates that Jesus and his disciples are on a "journey" through Galilee. This notion of journey contains theological overtones as well as geographical information. While teaching his disciples, once again Jesus tells them that the Son of Man is to be handed over, killed, and after three days be raised up. This is the second time Jesus has told this to his disciples, but again they fail to understand him. Not only that, but they are also afraid to ask him any questions. This is part of a Markan theme of "fear versus faith." For the disciples, fear will ultimately win out.

To emphasize how much the disciples have missed the point, we are told that, along the journey, they had been discussing among themselves which one of them was the greatest. Jesus is talking about suffering and death while the disciples are talking about power, fame, and glory. Clearly, they are moving in opposite directions.
