Fr. Flach Scriptural Reflections for the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

“Through Him the Angels praise Your Majesty, Dominions adore & Powers tremble before You. Heaven & the virtues of heaven & the blessed Seraphim worship together with exultation. May our voices join with theirs in humble praise..”

The Catholic Church ranks celebrations throughout the liturgical year according to their importance. The top celebration is a solemnity. A solemnity outranks any other occasion, except for a more important solemnity. Next in order are a feast & then a memorial. There are ranks, but it is important to note that every Sunday is a solemnity because it is a celebration connected to Easter.

This coming **Thursday, the 29th of September**, we are celebrating in the Sacred Eucharist the Feast of Sts. Michael, Gabriel, & Raphael, Archangels. In the current edition of the Roman Missal, the mention of angels is brought to the fore more than ever.

The Catechism teaches us that “the existence of the spiritual, non-corporeal beings that Sacred Scripture usually calls ‘angels’ is a truth of faith” (No. 329). St. Augustine explains angels a bit saying that term “angel” is the name of the beings’ office. By nature, they are “spirit,” therefore “angel” describes what the spirits do, not what they are. (The word “angel,” from Greek, means “messenger.”)

Early art often shows angels wearing the liturgical vestments of deacons. In copying the liturgical garments of deacons, angels were depicted dressed in white because of deacons’ white albs. Sometimes angels are shown in elaborately embroidered copes, especially in art showing the Nativity. One style of dress was never depicted: angels were never shown dressed as a priest because, in such paintings, Christ is the priest whom, like, deacons, the angels serve.

What of our readings today? If angels are messengers & servants of God, then we must take note of Luke’s statement about our earthly messengers, that is, Moses & the prophets. In response to the rich man’s pleas that Abraham would send a warning to the rest of his family about the consequence of how they were living, Abraham responded, “They have Moses & the prophets. Let them listen to them.” Luke was trying to speak to his communities about lack of belief in Christ, so he used this parable to teach about those who will not listen. After Abraham said to the rich man that his family already had the prophets, Luke used Jesus’ parable to allow the rich

man to ask that someone from the dead be allowed to return & warn his family of their potential fate. Luke’s parable allows a powerful judgment to be made: Some people are so deaf to God that even “if someone from the dead goes to them, they will not repent.”

The parable points out to us the sin of the rich man, & it is a terrible sin.

In no way does the parable condemn the man for being rich. Being wealthy was thought to be a blessing from God, an outward sign that God had favored a person. On the other hand, the poverty of a person like Lazarus was thought to be a curse from God. The assumption at the beginning of the parable would have been that the rich man would have been carried off by angels to the bosom of Abraham & that Lazarus would have been the one sent to the netherworld. Parables destroy expectations, & with this parable Jesus radically reversed expectations.

The sin Jesus pointed to is the fact that not only did the rich man not assist Lazarus, the man completely failed to notice Lazarus. Even in death, the rich man saw Lazarus as nothing more than a servant. For God, failure to notice the suffering of a fellow human being is inexcusable & merits torment.

That parable says, “When the poor man died, he was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham.” The mention of angels being sent to poor Lazarus was a powerful signal. The presence of angels signaled the presence of God. The presence of angels also signaled God’s protection. The role of the angels was so important that the parable could have stopped with the mention of angels & still have had similar impact.

Angels carry God’s message in their words & in their deeds.

We should *notice angels more. They are an expression of God’s notice for us.*
