

Fr. Flach Scriptural Reflections for The Sacred Feast of the Birth of Our Lord & Savior, Jesus Christ

What we celebrate today is so incredible it is hard to grasp what has happened. What God has done is almost incomprehensible ~ the mystery so big & so deep that at times its meaning & significance is lost on us. We see Christmas trees & decorative lights, we see presents, we hear the familiar carols, & we see Santa everywhere. We watch television specials from Rudolph to the Grinch. We make room for the ghosts of Christmases Past, Present & Future, & we imagine outdoing the generosity of the redeemed Scrooge. We relish our memories of childhoods past: meeting Santa, riding in the car with the family to see outdoor decorations, wondering how Santa got to everyone's house in the same night. Because we can lose the significance of Christmas, the sometimes frustrating, sometimes stressful & always frenetic sights & sounds of Christmas are important. We even bring this frenzy into our churches. Each year we make pilgrimages to our parishes for parties, to assemble Christmas food baskets & to help with other charities. Parents go to our "Children's Liturgy," & go to the magnificent Midnight Mass. The trees, the lights, the gifts, the parties, the television specials, the Christian services, & our Masses each have their role-the Mass definitely more important than the others-but each helps us fathom that what has happened is so incredible that it is almost beyond our ability to comprehend. Yet, if we've done these things properly, they help us remember that God has entered our lives. However, there is a limit to the power of our Christmas traditions & symbols. While they can be powerful & evocative outwardly, they do not always take us to that deep place in the heart where we ask, "What does it mean?" What does it mean that "God is with us"? Although we celebrate that God has done something, we often have a problem understanding its meaning because we ask the wrong question. At Christmas, we should not ask, "What does Christmas mean?" We should ask instead, "What does Christmas do?" Eventually we have to move past our colorful & exciting images & memories & return to Bethlehem. Here the images are very different. Here we see only a weary couple far from home, a husband & wife struggling to find comfort as they share the joy of a new child, a joy shared only by a few shepherds huddles together with their flocks near the manger.

In this image, everything is quiet, still & stark in its simplicity. We feel drawn & attached to this incredible & amazing silence that stands in startling contrast to the more public, noisy sights & sounds of Christmas. There is comfort in this silence. The Scriptures speak of salvation, & theologians the in-breaking of the Divine. But as intellectually satisfying as this talk can be, it never really speaks to the heart of those who long for the warm silence of Christmas Eve. Here we do not want words. We want only the silence. We need the silence that descends upon the home after the kids are in bed & after Santa has come. We want that tired & still moment of a mother & father sitting together before their tree, lost together in silent thoughts of their children. In this comfortable, cozy silence we understand that couple at the manger. We see what Christmas does. Not all of us are privileged to rejoice in the gift of marriage or children on Christmas Eve, but we know the image. We can see it in Mary & Joseph who stared at their child in a manger & pondered these things in their hearts. The silence of Christmas not only tells us of love, it lets us be in love. Our God has entered this world to whisper to us that He loves us, & in the same silence we realize how much we love Him. The dream that is given to us is that in the silence we have come to know that we can love each other. None of us wants the silence to end because then we will wake & know that the dream of the night is not yet fully upon us. But each Christmas reminds us that the gift is here if we wish to unwrap it & use it. We cannot contain our joy so we can celebrate in crazy ways, but we still rush to our "Silent Night," hoping that it will never end, longing for the day that the gift of God's powerful, unexplainable love is shared among us all.



CHRISTMAS GRACES



A great light shines forth (Isaiah 9:1); the light of Jesus' birth shines all about us...Our heart was already joyful in awaiting this moment; now that joy abounds & overflows, for the promise has been at least fulfilled.

Joy & gladness are a true sign that the message contained in the mystery of this

night is truly from God. There is no room for doubt; let us leave that to the skeptics who, by looking to reason alone, never find the truth. There is no room for the indifference which reigns in the hearts of those unable to love for fear of losing something. All sadness has been banished, for the Christ Jesus brings true comfort to every heart.

Today, the Son of God is born, & everything changes. The Savior of the world comes to partake of our human nature; no longer are we alone & forsaken. The Virgin offers us her Son as the beginning of a new life. The true light has come to illumine our lives so often beset by the darkness of sin. Today, we once more discover who we are! Tonight we have been shown the way to reach the journey's end. Now must we put away all fear & dread, for the light shows us the path to Bethlehem. We must not be laggards; we are not permitted to stand idle. We must set out to see our Savior lying in a

Manger. This is the reason for our joy & gladness: this Child has been born to us; he was given to us, as Isaiah proclaims (cf. 9:5)...

If we take him in our arms & let ourselves be embraced by Him, He will bring us unending peace of heart...From now on, the way of authentic liberation & perennial redemption is open to every man & woman who is simple of heart...In a society so often intoxicated by consumerism & hedonism, wealth & extravagance, appearances & Narcissism, this Child calls us to act soberly, in other words, in a way that is simple, balances, consistent, capable of seeing & doing what is essential. In a world which all too often is merciless to the sinner & lenient to the sin, we need to cultivate a strong sense of justice, to discern & to do God's will. Amid a culture of indifference which not infrequently turns ruthless, our style of life should instead be devout, filled with empathy, compassion, & mercy, drawn daily from the wellspring of prayer. Like the shepherds of Bethlehem, may we too, with eyes full of amazement & wonder, gaze upon the Child Jesus, the Son of God. And in His presence may our hearts burst forth in prayer:

**Show us, Lord,
your mercy,
& grant us your salvation. (Ps. 85:7)**
